Foreword From Our Patron

Five months ago, close to 86,000 representatives of national delegations, business, and international organisations gathered in Dubai for the 28th annual United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP28) – the most significant international climate event since the UK-hosted COP26 two years ago in Glasgow.

COP28 came at a crucial time in keeping our target of limiting global temperature rise to 1.5°C alive. It was also particularly momentous as it marked the conclusion of the first ever global stocktake of collective progress against the goals of the Paris Agreement.

The stocktake found that while there has been progress in climate action, it needs to be accelerated – rapidly, and across all areas, including reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening resilience to a changing climate, and getting the financial and technological support to vulnerable nations. In a landmark outcome, for the first time, countries agreed on the need to transition away from fossil fuels in energy systems, to renewables such as wind and solar power in their next round of climate commitments.

Collaboration is imperative to hitting these climate goals. The UK-Singapore Green Economy Framework, now just over



a year old, highlights our countries' shared commitment in achieving our ambitious net zero commitments and contributing to the development of a vibrant green economy ecosystem that can have an impact beyond our two shores.

The agreement, focused on enabling real-world climate and economic outcomes. leverages our countries strengths in areas like low carbon energy technologies, shipping and aviation, and finance to deliver long-term sustainable policy, regulation and technical solutions and projects between our private sector and academic communities.

It has been encouraging to see business and industry already exploit some of arowth and collaboration these opportunities and begin to make the most of them. I am grateful to the British Chamber and its membership for being the first to sign to up government/industry collaboration. My team and I remain ready to support more of endeavours across the Framework's key pillars of green transport, low carbon energy technologies, and sustainable finance and carbon markets.

We have also doubled down on these commitments through the launch of the UK-Singapore Strategic Partnership by our Prime Ministers last year – reinforcing our aim to deliver on the Green Economy Framework and going beyond this to commit to greater collaboration with Singapore on nuclear fusion, green skills, strategic infrastructure investment, and the blue economy.



This certificate is issued on 12 APR 2024.



Building a Culture of Sustainability in Business Through Events

The Chamber shapes the conversations around sustainability in different industries by leveraging its business networks and relationships with the Singapore and UK governments. We achieve this by engaging with businesses and connecting them to experts and networks through sustainability meetings and events.

We organised and participated in a number of events throughout the year covering the energy transition, decarbonisation, sustainable finance, green power imports, climate change, and climate reporting.

Supporting University of Birmingham and World Wide Generation on Better Sustainability Reporting





Future of Work Theme



Talent availability, retention of manpower and increasing costs to businesses are the top 3 concerns of our members Salary expectations, the competitive market for local talent and a perceived lack of requisite technical skills and expertise have increased the difficulty of finding the right talent.

Through its Future of Work theme, the Chamber provides engagement opportunities and platforms to both members and government bodies. We do this through members' dialogues with the Minister of Manpower (MOM) Singapore, and closed-door briefings with MOM. The Chamber also actively shares feedback from the business community as the COMPASS framework is rolled out and conducts discussions with the trade associations ecosystem in Singapore


Close Consultations and Engagements with Ministry of Manpower Singapore

The Chamber continues working closely with the Ministry of Manpower in Singapore. We represent the interests of our members by flagging any recurring issues and raising workplace trends from our sentiment surveys.

We also hosted Minister for Manpower Dr Tan See Leng in our annual members' closed-door dialogue event on 7 September 2023. Members got to engage and consult with the Minister on workforce and manpower issues.









Spearheading the UK- Southeast Asia Trade Digitalisation Pilot Initiative



The British Chamber of Commerce Singapore, together with LogChain, is working with the UK Government to develop a series of follow-up pilot programmes, helping to digitalise supply chains between the UK and South East Asia. The projects were announced on 28 September 2023 by the British High Commissioner to Singapore, Her Excellency Kara Owen CMG CVO.

With over 28.5 billion documents generated in logistics each year, the programme seeks to engage companies to champion the adoption of electronic transferable records, between the UK, Singapore and Thailand.

These initiatives seek to demonstrate further digital adoption via actual shipments, garner industry support and opinion via roundtables and discussions, developing case studies to help further adoption across sectors. The project is currently ongoing in 2024.

Driving Trade in the Region

The Chamber's Trade Services team has already made significant progress in 2024 in delivering the UK-Southeast Asia Trade Digitalisation Pilot Initiative.

Beyond the pilot, the Chamber has also been leading roundtables related to trade and trade digitalisation. Together with the British High Commission in Singapore and the Department of Business and Trade, the Chamber organised a roundtable covering the UK Critical Imports and Supply Chains Strategy, with support from businesses on their views of supply chain resilience.

The Chamber's Trade Services team also delivered a session on trade digitalisation and moderated a panel at the UK-Southeast Asia Tech Week 2024,



Supply Chain Digitalisation: Beyond Buzzwords

The Chamber's Transport Logistics and Supply Chain Committee (TLSC) organised a panel discussion on digitalisation and change management on 28 September 2023. The panel took the conversation beyond the buzzwords and the latest technology - delving into the importance of understanding how to navigate change effectively as businesses of all sizes undergo digital transformations.

The event featured keynote speaker Chris Southworth (International Chamber of Commerce), and a panel of industry experts comprising Kaushik Ghatak; Hannah Nguyen (International Chamber of Commerce); and moderator Carl Hemus (Asendia).



Supporting New Market Entrants from the UK

The Chamber supports new market entrants coming in from the United Kingdom. We do this by providing entrants with valuable information to facilitate the setup of business and connecting them with our strong business and government network across Singapore and the UK.

Relaunching the Chamber's Trade Services



The Chamber made plans to relaunch its trade services as part of its support to market entrants from the UK.

Some of the team's bespoke in-market support will include market briefings, one-toone meetings and receptions for Trade Missions of UK companies; support on setting up an initial entity; and market research.



The UK's Commitment to Trade in the Region

The UK has taken a number of significant steps towards global trade relations in recent years, including the following achievements during 2023.

Highlight 1

UK and Singapore signed an MOU on the UK-Singapore Green Economy Framework to promote bilateral cooperation in the green economy, support growth and create jobs in the green sector.

Highlight 2

Singapore and the United Kingdom (UK) signed a Mutual Recognition Arrangement (MRA) of Authorised Economic Operator (AEO) programmes on 23 June 2023. Businesses from both countries can now import goods from one another with less documentation and cargo inspections





Highlight 3

Singapore PM Lee Hsien Loong and UK PM Rishi Sunak jointly announced the upgrade of relations between the UK and Singapore to a Strategic Partnership.

Highlight 4

The UK-Singapore Bilateral Investment Treaty announced earlier in 2023 started negotiations in March 2023 and is reaching its conclusion.



Through our <u>Future of Trade</u> theme, the Chamber continues to ensure members receive updates on these critical milestones and what these may mean for their business.



Measuring Business Sentiment



Each year the Chamber polls members several times to understand the challenges and opportunities of their business and specific sector. Beyond comparable metrics, we also seek to understand perspectives on talent issues and CSR priorities.

Remaining positive for the future, with over three-quarters of businesses confirming their confidence in Singapore as a business hub for the long-term, satisfaction in today's business climate was split with a near 50-50 result. Despite a challenging period for hiring, retaining staff and balancing budgets, companies reported several positives. Interest in ASEAN remains a priority for the majority of members and the aggregated average proportion of Singaporean citizens and permanent residents among the respondents is 68%.

Members shared their observations of skills gaps in critical thinking, business acumen and technical skills at an industry level. It is important to note that these issues are not unique to foreign-owned businesses, particularly cost and talent pool challenges, as seen in the SBF National Business Survey.






Bringing the Best of UK-SG Education to Members
